Schedule

OCTOBER 25-26, 2024 *Opening - In person Retreat at Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp* **Gospel + Christianity 101**

This retreat is meant to introduce participants to each other, build community through team building activities and games, and to give the basics of Christianity including the story of the gospels (especially focusing on the Incarnation and the Passion) and the Apostle's Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Ten Commandments.

NOVEMBER 24TH, 2024 - SESSION 1 VIA ZOOM **Hebrew Bible 101 - 5-6:30pm**

This session contextualizes the Christian story within its Jewish origins and will emphasize the idea of covenant, and the creation, exodus, and the stories as the major themes to understand in the Hebrew Bible.

JANUARY 26TH, 2025 - SESSION 2 VIA ZOOM **New Testament 101 - 5-6:30pm**

This session returns to the story of Jesus and continues into the experience of the early church. Participants will learn about the different gospels, the Apostles, and Paul as an early interpreter of the church and of grace.

FEBRUARY 23RD, 2025 - SESSION 3 VIA ZOOM **Lutheran History + Theology - 5-6:30pm**

This session will introduce the basics of Lutheran theology (the theology of the cross, the doctrine of grace) through the history of the Protestant Reformation. Participants will learn about who Luther was, what his disagreements with the Catholic Church were, and the reforms in theology and practices that came about through the Reformation.

MARCH 23RD, 2025 - SESSION 4 VIA ZOOM **Lutheran Worship + Sacraments - 5-6:30pm**

This session will give the participants an orientation to the general flow of worship so they are better able to participate in services, including a theological overview of each part of worship. The worship introduction serves as a springboard into discussing Eucharist and baptism within the Lutheran tradition.

APRIL 4-5, 2025 *Closing Retreat in person at FLBC* **Public Christianity**

This retreat will celebrate the growth of the participants through the program and connect the faith they have learned to their daily lives. We will return to the Lord's Prayer, the Apostle's Creed, and the Ten Commandments and reflect on them in a new light with the greater context they have earned over the last several months. Campers will be asked to choose a problem they see in the world and reflect on it through the lens of their faith to practice engaging the world theologically.
