Whether helping in the kitchen, cleaning, leading activities for campers, completing a work project or joining in with a group for Bible study, volunteers are invaluable! I'm registered, what's next?

When is everything due?

For campers registered before June 1st:

• Full payment, health form, and required waivers are due by June 1st.

For those registering after June 1st:

• Full payment is due at time of registration. Please complete forms online at the time of enrollment or as soon as possible.

Having forms filled out online early will:

- Make registration go much smoother for you and your camper.
- Allow your camper's counselor to review their information and better care for your camper
- Improve your church campership communication
- Help us have your camper's medical information readily available at a moment's notice.

What time should I arrive at camp for my week?

For STAR campers, pick one focus:

Camp registration takes place each week on

Sunday afternoon from 3:30–5:00PM (Wednesday afternoon for Half-Week campers). Registration will be located near the basketball court or, if it's raining, in the Cockrell Center. All programs begin & end at FLBC!

When is the camp week over?

Camp ends with a closing worship/program at 11 AM on the last day of your camper's session (this could be Tuesday for first-half, half week campers, Wednesday for Week 4 campers, or Friday for full week sessions). Family and friends are invited to join us for worship in the Amphitheater, located just beyond the parking lot. Departure is around noon!

The Shalom Home!

Staff housing at FLBC has been an issue since the beginning of the camp in 1943!! Early directors will tell you about living in tents (when camp was only open in the summer!), and Gary and Carol Cockrell have stories about the 2-bedroom home they raised 4 boys in at camp (which also served as the welcome center, office, reception area and more, and currently is the on-site camp office).

With the need for on-site housing to allow us to continue to find the best staff and to protect the camp, the FLBC board has been working on this issue for years. Given the high prices for rent in the Flathead Valley, the time to act is now!

FLBC is working to build a home on Hughes Bay (near our sailing/boating area) on a foundation that was built several years ago. Having a staff residence on this side of camp offers security and protection for this area, while also giving staff a little more privacy from the busy year-round traffic of camp.

As always, flexibly is the name of the game; thus, the home has been designed to meet the needs of the camp in different ways. The home will be able to accommodate one family or two couples, or 3 single people. It is also built with the idea that if it is not needed for staff housing, it can be used as a small retreat center or guest housing throughout the year.
